## 2009 HIGHLIGHTS BY VERONICA

We actively engaged volunteers, over the age of fifty, in the Family Match Program which helped to promote strong extended families.

Our volunteers placed in the School Grandparent Program have encouraged a positive learning environment for countless children enrolled in elementary schools in the Lower Mainland.

We gained program exposure through media coverage. A magazine article titled 'Celebrating Grandparents,' was published in BC Parent Magazine profiling our organization.

We dispersed the Mary Florio Bursary to three different families amounting to a total of \$1800. The funds enabled parents to enrol their children in music classes and dance classes.

Over 65 volunteers, families and members attended our Volunteer Appreciation BBQ August 2009, at Confederation Park.

Through the Canada Summer Jobs initiative, VG secured summer student Eliza Sam, who created a children's contest to help bring awareness to Grandparents Day in September.

In December 2009, we became a partner agency with Kids Up Front. Their mandate is to provide access to arts, culture, sport and recreation for children who otherwise do not have the opportunity. Many of our program participants have enjoyed the benefits of being enrolled in this program.

Volunteer Grandparents strives to maintain a diverse funding base and relies on support from individuals, companies, foundations, governments and the BC Gaming Commission. We would like to thank our supporters, including the United Way, for investing in our programs. Additionally, we would like to thank the PNE, Vancouver Symphony, Playland and MusicFest Vancouver for providing numerous ticket opportunities for program participants.
