2012 Program Highlights

Our organization actively engaged volunteers, over the age of fifty, in the Family Match and School Grandparent Programs which helped to promote strong extended families and created a positive learning environment for countless children enrolled in elementary schools in the Lower Mainland.

Volunteers Count:

We had a total of 108 amazing volunteers (including School Grandparents, Family Match Program Participants, Program Ambassadors, Event Volunteers, Website and Administrative Volunteers, and Board Members) in 2012 who contributed 4533 volunteer hours to our organization with an estimated monetary value of \$159, 590!

Initiating New Programs to Gain Awareness

Securing financial support from the New Horizons for Seniors (NHFS) Initiative we were able to initiate an Ambassador Program.
