

LETTERS TO SENIORS

In 2021, a total of 1231 letters were sent to isolated seniors. 1082 of these were handmade cards, drawings, and letters sent by participants in our Phase 1 of the program, while 149 were longer letters exchanged between seniors and youth

taking part in Phase 2 of our program.
